

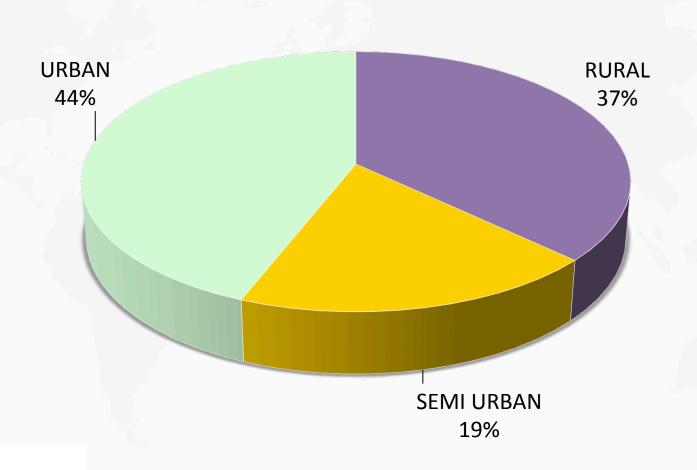

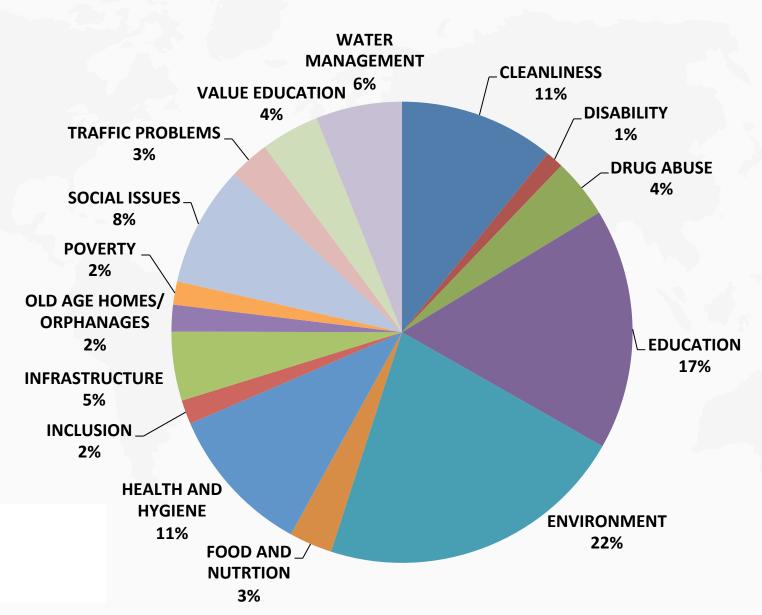
Type of schools taking part

Most inclusive initiative



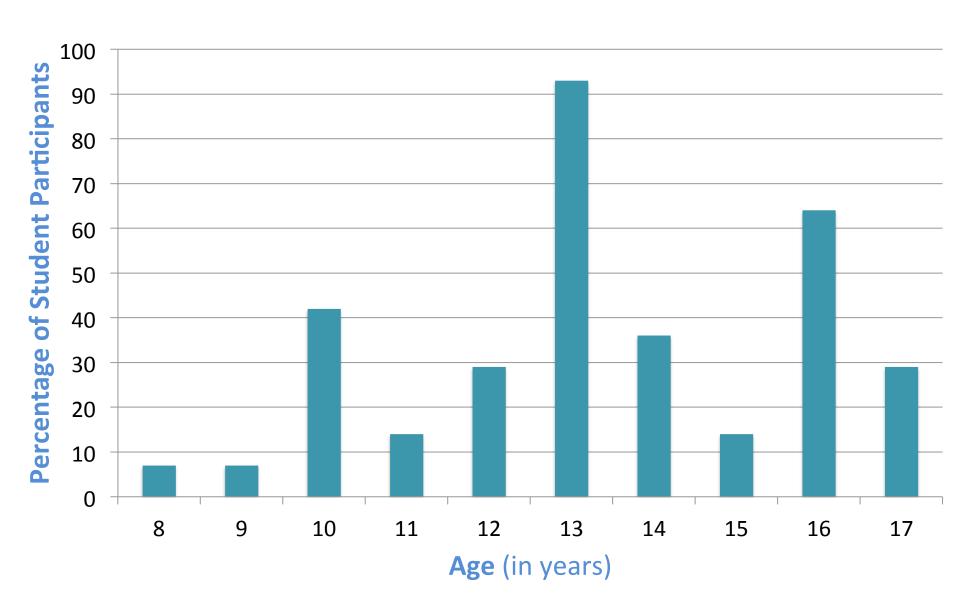
Causes Represented over the years

16 diverse causes



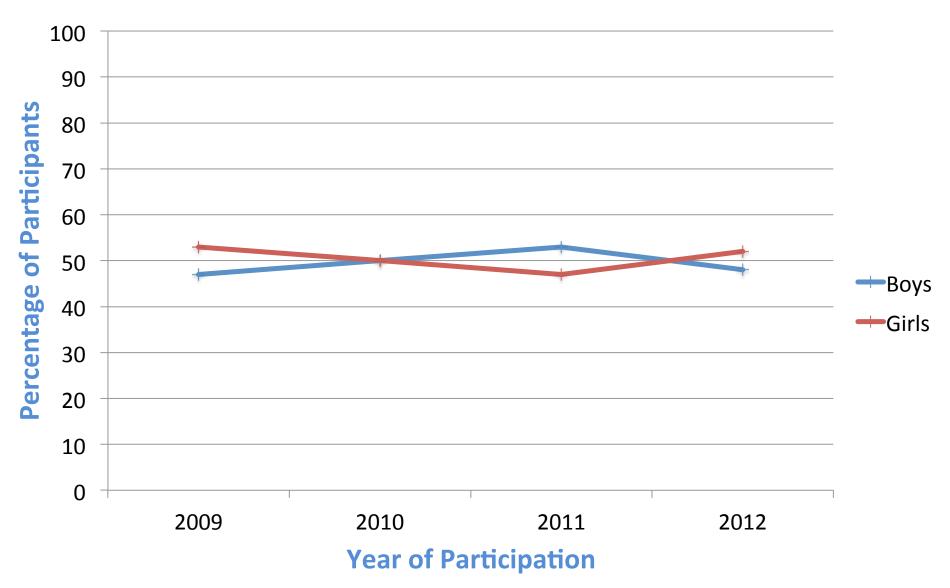
Age of Student Participants over the years

Most participation from 13 year old students



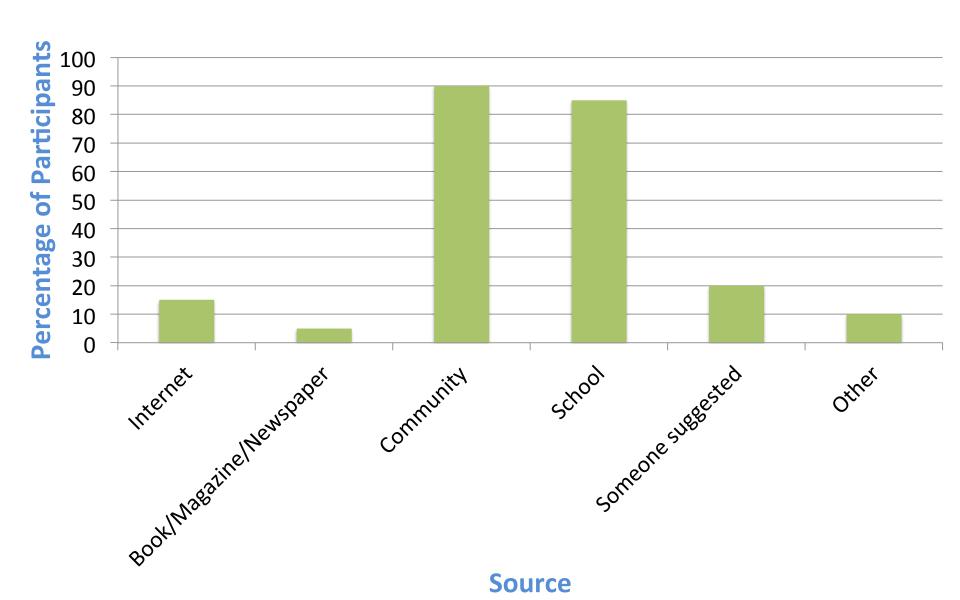
Gender of Student Participants over the years

Equal participation from both genders



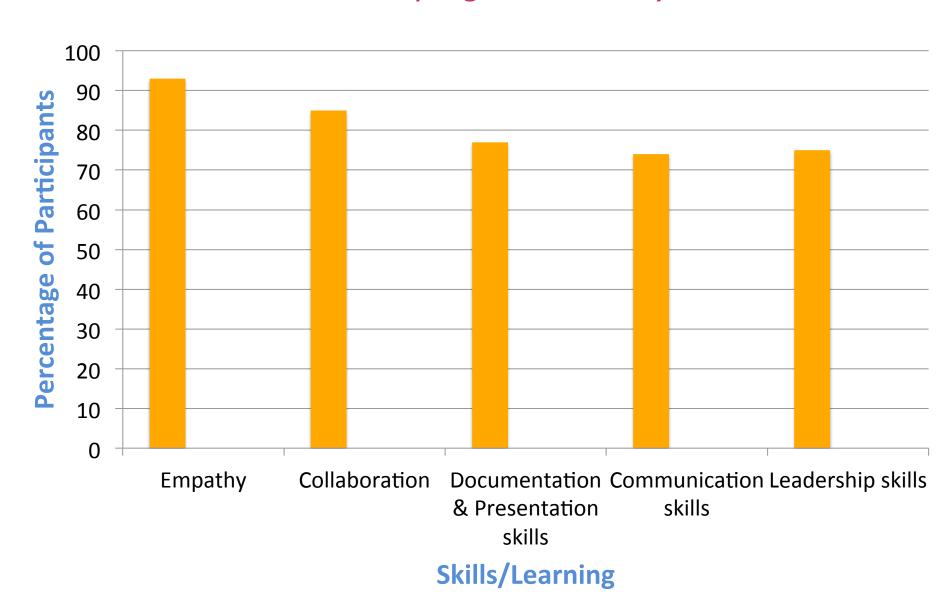
Source of idea

Most ideas came from the community/school itself



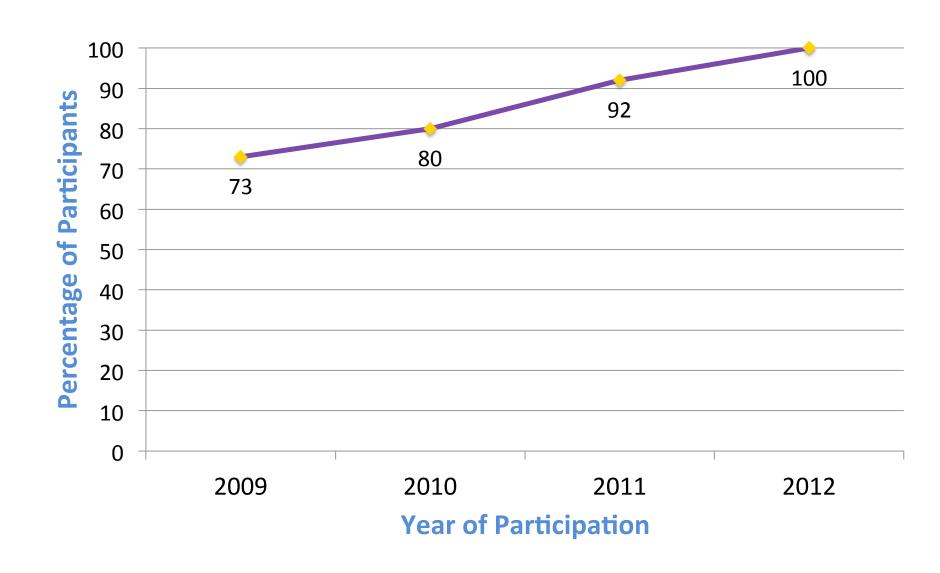

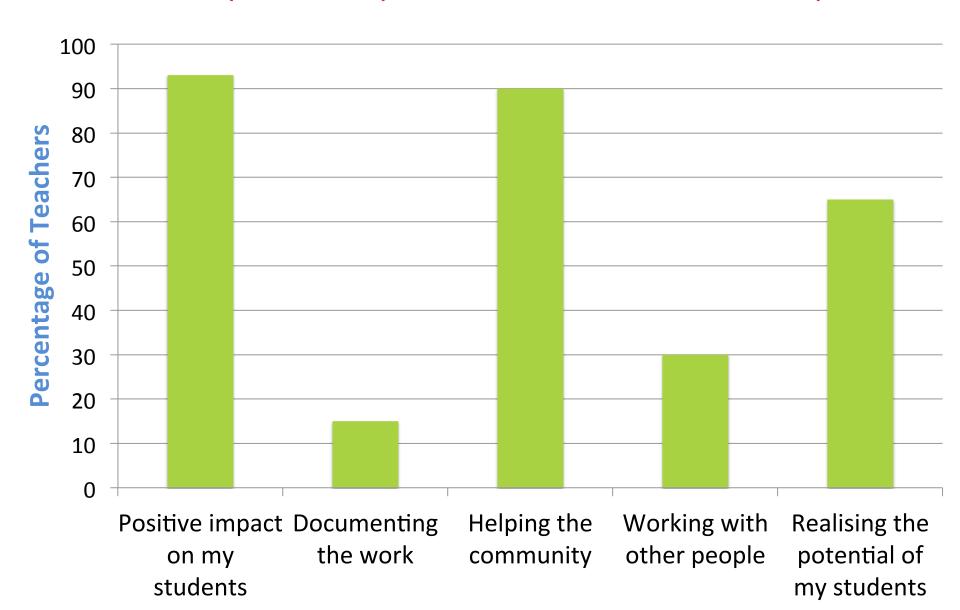
Students wanting to participate year after year

More students wanting to participate every year



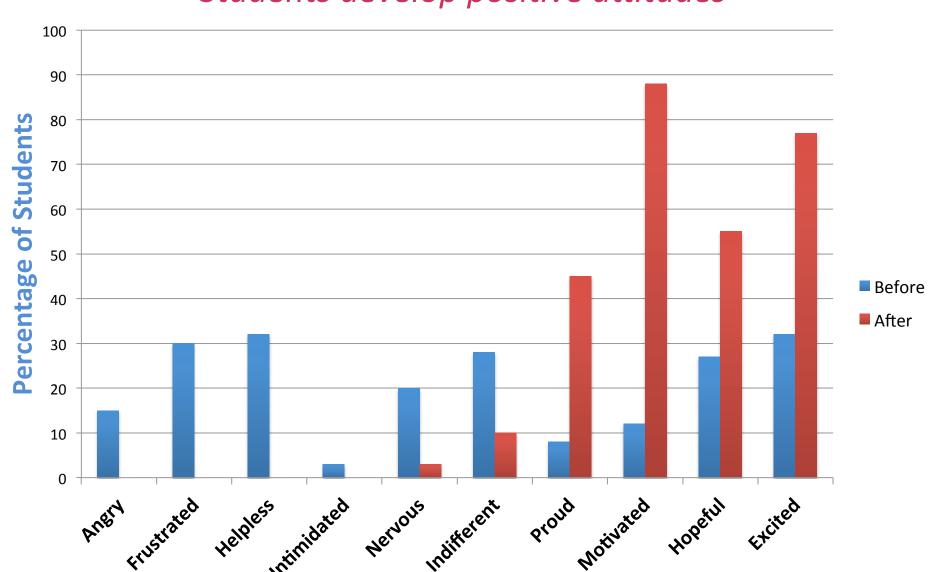
What teachers liked in the School Challenge the most

Teachers see a positive impact on students/ Realise their potential



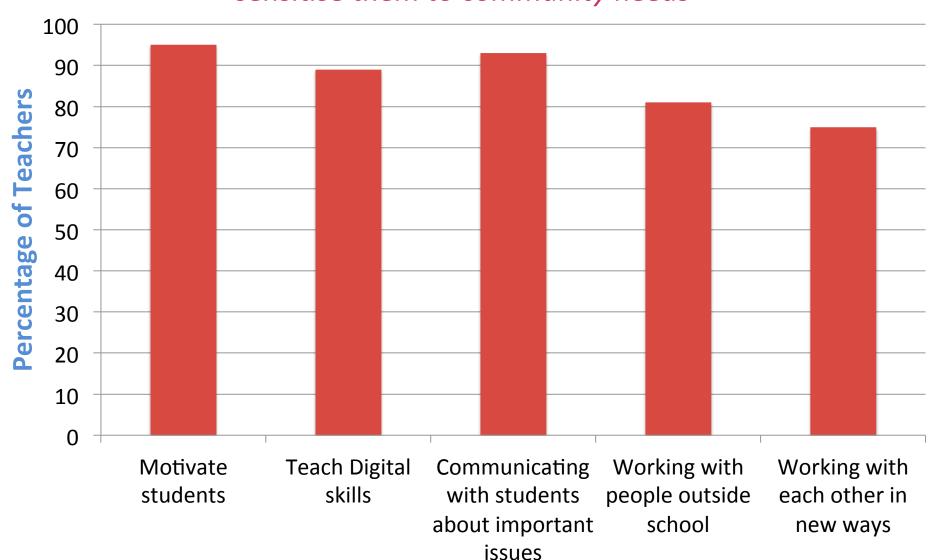
Shift in Attitudes of Students
